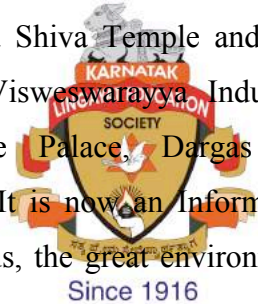

RULES OF THE FEST

Participation in Trial Advocacy is compulsory.

2. Language for all the events shall be English.

3. Eligibility:

- Participants shall be *bona-fide* students currently pursuing Bachelors Degree in law i.e. 3 Year LL.B. Programme or 5 Year LL.B. Programme from Law schools/colleges recognized by the Bar Council of India.
- Only one team per college shall participate.
- Participation shall be restricted to the **first 16 teams registered.**

4. Team Composition

- Each team shall comprise of THREE members.
- One person shall not participate in more than three events.
- Participant participating in Judgment writing competition shall not take part in Legal drafting competition

5. Confirmation and Registration:

- Registration Fees is Rs. 4000/- (Rupees Four Thousand Only), which includes lodging, boarding and local conveyance during the days of the competition.
- The demand draft shall be drawn in favour of “The Principal, K.L.E. Society's Law College, Bengaluru”

- The team shall confirm the participation through e-mail to klelawfest2016@gmail.com by sending scanned copy of the registration form and the demand draft of Rs. 4000/- on or before 08th October 2016.
- The team shall send the hardcopy of the duly filled registration form along with the DD so as to reach us on or before 14th October, 2016

6. Dress code shall be Advocates' attire according to BCI norms, except band.

7. Scouting is strictly prohibited. Scouting may result in disqualification and in case of default the organizers decision is final.

8. Lodging and Boarding:

The Organizers shall provide lodging and boarding to the registered participants from 21st to 23rd October 2016 (3 days).

9. Miscellaneous:

- All registered teams are required to report on 21st October, 2016 at the registration desk at K.L.E Society's Law College, Bengaluru between 9.00 a.m. to 10.00 a.m.

- Each team shall be given code number at the time of online registration. The teams shall not reveal the identity of their College/University in their written submissions and during the Competitions.

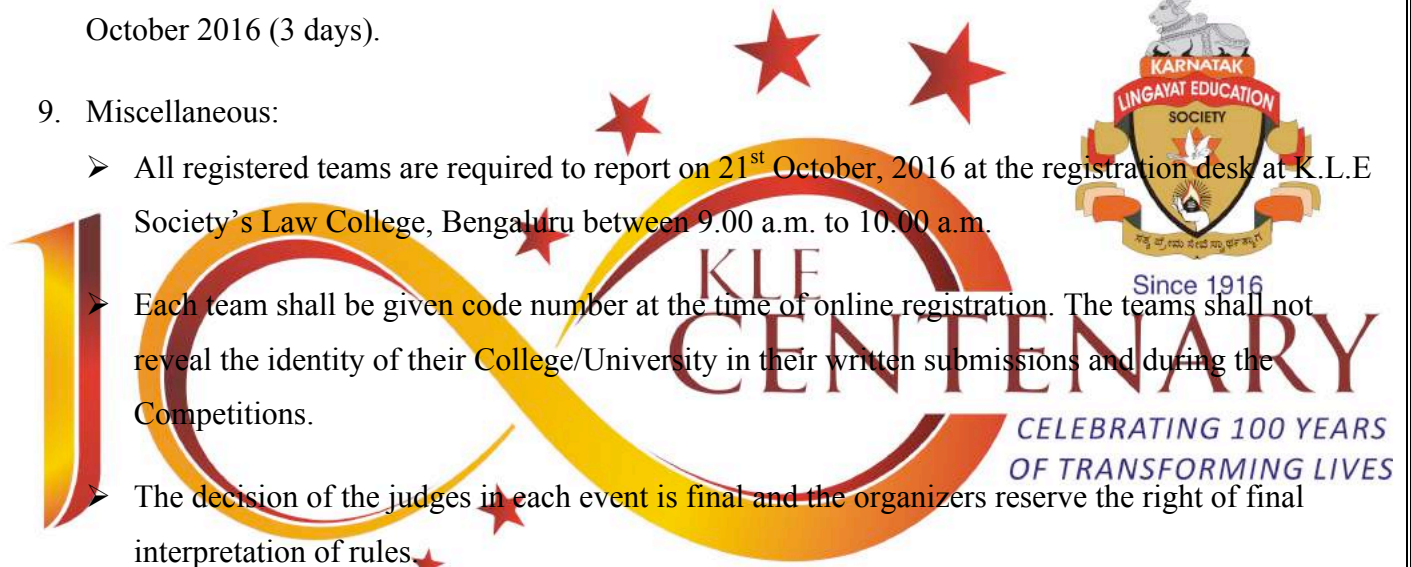
- The decision of the judges in each event is final and the organizers reserve the right of final interpretation of rules.

TRIAL ADVOCACY RULES

Trail Advocacy fills up the vacuum where the competition hones the skills required in the trial court. The mental abilities of lawyers are sharpened through rigorous rounds of examination-in-chief and cross-examination, attention to detail, documents review and gives ample scope for creativity. Trail Advocacy competition is the best platform to fine-tune qualities of a lawyer and it prepares the participants to the challenges in the trial court. The vibrancy during a trial attracts students both to the books and the court making the experience of a student in law school more enjoyable.

1. The Trial Advocacy Competition shall be held on 22nd and 23rd Oct.2016.
2. The team shall conduct the trial of both prosecution and defense by examining the witnesses.
3. The Competition shall comprise of: -
 - Preliminary rounds

- Semi-finals
 - Finals
4. Each round shall comprise of:
- Pre-trial session
 - Trial Session

I Pre-trial Session and Other information

- Participants shall be allotted 40 minutes to brief their witness in all the rounds.
- The witness list for the Prosecution and Defense shall be as provided in the Brief.
- Organizers shall provide the witnesses for all the rounds.
- Teams shall brief the witnesses within the prescribed time.
- Teams shall plan to examine any of the witnesses from the list within the allotted time.
- Teams shall submit list of witnesses they intend to examine to their respective court officer before briefing the witnesses.
- Each counsel shall examine the witnesses of either side in every round.
- Any one of the witnesses may turn hostile in all the rounds and the participants should be prepared to handle the situation.
- Order of conducting trial between two counsels shall be notified to the Court-Officers prior to the commencement of each Round.
- Exchange of memorials shall take place during the draw of lots for all the rounds.
- The opponent's memorial shall be returned after each round.
- Memorial Marks shall be considered for Preliminary Round only.

II Trial Session

Preliminary Round

- There will be two rounds for each team (Prosecution and Defense) to be determined by draw of lots.
- Each team shall present for both the sides compulsorily before a new bench of Judges and against a new participating team.
- Each team shall have 1 hour (Cumulative) time to complete its Examination –in- Chief, Cross Examination and Closing Statement.
- Four teams shall qualify for semifinals based on the highest number of wins and the aggregate marks in each round shall be considered. In case of tie, team with highest marks in orals will qualify to the semi-finals. In case of further tie the decision of the organizers shall be final.

Semi-Final Round

- Each team shall present on either side, which shall be determined by draw of lots.
- This will be a Knock-Out Round.
- Each team shall have 1hour (Cumulative) time to complete its Examination –in- Chief, Cross Examination and Closing Statement.

Final Round

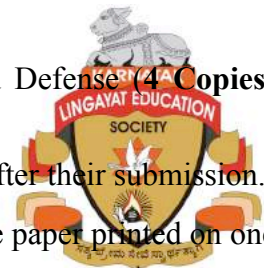

5. Written Submission

The following requirements for memorials shall be strictly complied with.

- No revisions, supplements, or additions shall be allowed in the memorials after their submission.

- Font Style shall be Times New Roman and double-spaced. The font size shall be 12.
- Footnotes- Font size: 10, Font Style: Times New Roman, single space between footnotes.
- Memorials must have a one-inch margin on all sides of pages.
- Page numbering should be on the top right side of pages.
- Memorials shall be spirally bound.
- Colour Code: Prosecution-Blue; Defence- Red

Rules For Paper Presentation

Concept Note:

21st Century is a information technology era. Usage of internet on computers, laptops, tablets and cell phones has eased the life of people in many ways and saving the time and energy while they do many works by using internet. This virtual world which is known as cyber world is a mixed bag of advantages and dis-advantages. While it is used for easing various works, it is also grossly misused for committing offences. Many new breed of offences called cyber crimes are being committed by using modern communication gadgets and internet. The worst victims of the cyber crimes are women. Cyber stalking, Cyber morphing, Cyber Harassment, Cyber pornography, Cyber Defamation. Email spoofing, etc., are ruining the lives of many women. India being one of the few countries to have IT law to regulate the online activities, at cyber crimes are on the rise. In this backdrop it is felt that there is need for research and deliberation specifically about the cyber crimes against women.

The Paper Presentation competition will be conducted on October 21st, 2016.

Theme: Cyber Crimes Against Women

Submission Guidelines

1. The participant shall prepare paper on any topic related to the above mentioned theme.
2. Abstract shall be of 500 words and should consist of 5 keywords.
3. Manuscript must be in English.
4. One-inch margin shall be maintained on all four sides.
5. Full paper shall be submitted in PDF format on or before 18th October 2016.
6. Formatting requirements: 1.5 line spacing, Font style - Times new roman, headings in bold and 14 points, text 12 points and footnotes 10 points.
7. Full paper shall be within 3500 words including abstract.
8. Citation must be in accordance with Harvard Blue Book 19th Edition.
9. Co-authorship is not permitted.



LEGAL DRAFTING RULES

The participant is provided with a factual situation. The participant shall draft a petition/complaint/plaint, as the case may be. The statement of fact shall be given at the time of the competition and the participant shall draft the petition/complaint/plaint as per the standard procedure observed in the courts of India.

The legal drafting competition will be conducted on October 21st, 2016

1. Rules:

- The statement of facts shall be given at the time of the competition and the draft shall be handwritten in the sheets provided by the organizers.
- Duration for legal draft shall be two hours – The first 30 minutes of the duration shall be devoted for analysis and appreciation of facts statement and the next 80 minutes for legal drafting and last 10 minutes for organizing the papers and stitching neatly.
- The completed draft shall be in the following format:
 - Index Sheet
 - Petition/complaint/plaint as the case may be.
 - List of Documents (To be listed as per the demands of the facts)
 - Annexures (May be left blank but the participant shall give headings to the Annexures)
 - Vakalatnama (Shall be provided by the Organizers)

- The participants shall also identify the competent court and they are free to use their prudence while drafting the cause title and other related elements which are involved in the process of drafting. Once the draft is ready it shall be stitched using needles and thread provided by the organizers.
- Copying, using electronic gadgets etc.... is prohibited.
- Borrowing study materials or any other substances from other participants is prohibited.
- Bare Acts required for reference shall be provided by the Organizers, which shall be taken back after first 30 minutes.
- The participants shall draft within the ambit of the statement of facts.

- Precision in drafting.
- Drafting in Conformity with Procedural Laws.

- Family Law.

Law Quiz Rules

The quiz competition will be conducted on October 23rd, 2016

1. Team comprising of two members shall take part in the quiz.

6. Language and style should be consistent.
7. The following format is to be followed and participants may add more clauses if it be required
 - Facts in brief
 - Issues
 - Application of law
 - Ratio Decidendi
 - Justification of decision
 - Operative order
 - Obiter dicta (the judge's mind)
 - Creative interpretation of citations, facts, law and innovative approach
8. The participants shall be provided with Internet enabled computers, books and other references for the session. Campus Wi-Fi will be available to the teams.
9. Relevant documents along with the case shall be provided on the spot.
10. Participants shall be given 30 minutes before the start of the session to prepare.
11. The participant gets one and half hour to write judgment.

Trial Advocacy Proposition

Amisha, aged 26 is a resident of Bengaluru. Her parents register her profile on a popular matrimonial website “Humsafar.com”. On 12.01.2016, Bhuvan, aged 25, a resident of Delhi, contacts Amisha through the said website. They indulge in chats, talk about each other's families, exchange phone numbers, e-mail ids; thereby divulge information about their places of residence etc.

After the exchange of a few conversations, Bhuvan proposes to marry Amisha, but she finds him to be a little possessive and aggressive in his talks, at times. She stops responding to his messages for 2 days. In the meantime, she discusses it with her friend Nandini, who works with her at ARS Technologies, Bengaluru. Nandini advised Amisha to break off all communication with him on some pretext. Likewise, Amisha informs Bhuvan through an SMS that her parents are against the proposal as she is a year older to him.

Bhuvan floods her WhatsApp account with messages questioning him being rejected and asks her to reconsider her decision. He calls her several times a day on her number. Irritated with his behavior, she changes her mobile number, after which she stops receiving messages or calls. He sends her messages on Facebook stating that he will somehow stay in touch with her and get her to change her mind.

On 03.02.2016, Amisha posts an update on her social networking page that she was off to the movies at a mall close to her home. On returning home, she sees that there is a message in her inbox from an unknown WhatsApp account, asking her if she enjoyed the movie and complemented her for looking good in the blue dress. Amisha doubts Bhuvan to have sent this message, but decides otherwise as he is a resident of Delhi and cannot be in Bengaluru. So, she chooses to ignore it.

A week later, while she dines outside with her family, she receives the images of herself having dinner with her family, from an unknown number on Whatsapp. It is followed by messages of marriage proposal to her. She suspects Bhuvan behind all of this and leaves a message asking him to stay out of her life and to understand that she would never marry him.

Bhuvan, being obsessed with Amisha, is unable to take ‘NO’ for an answer. The sense of being rejected leads him to consume excessive amount of alcohol daily. Since he is not able to convince Amisha, Bhuvan takes to blackmailing her. He then starts messaging her saying that if she does not agree to marry him, he will use the pictures, uploaded by her on her social networking page, and morph the images to post those for the world to see.

Being upset with the developments Amisha decides to tell her all problems to Nandini. On 15/02/2016 Amisha in conversation with Nandini, told that, recently their team leader had proposed her, but she refused to accept the same; and that’s the reason for withholding her promotion in the Company. She also expressed that she is very depressed and feels like committing suicide at times due to all her problems. Nandini admonishes her and advises her to inform her parents and seek the help of the Police, before things went out of control. Nandini insisted Amisha to join the getaway to Chandi Hills, on the outskirts of Bengaluru, over the weekend planned by employees of the company and Amisha agreed to join with all hesitations. The same is updated on her social networking page. On 21.02.2016, Amisha leaves with her co-employees to Chandi Hills at 3:00 am, hoping to take her mind off from all the disturbing incidents.

They reach the destination by 5:30 am to see the sunrise. Later, Amisha and her co-employees decide to see the famous “Sultana Drop” at Chandi Hills. While walking up to see it, Bhuvan walks up to Amisha and tries to pull her aside to talk. Amisha is taken aback to see Bhuvan there, especially in an inebriated condition. Amisha fights him off and asks him to stay away from her and out of her life. Her co-employees interfere and Bhuvan finally walks away. They asked her to calm down and assured that they are all with her and that she has nothing to fear.

By 7:30 am, Amisha's co-employees decide to move to a place close by to have tea as the weather was getting chilly. Amisha, being all upset asks to be left alone for a few minutes and tells them that she would join them soon. Nandini advises her against it and asks her to come along. Amisha insists that she wants some time for herself and wants to be left alone. Nandini leaves reluctantly with the others, asking her to come soon.

When Amisha does not join them even after 8:30 am, Nandini feels that there is something amiss. She and the other co-employees start looking for Amisha. On not being able to find her even after diligent search for long time, they informed Amisha's parents that she had gone missing. The parents filed a missing person complaint with the jurisdictional police and sought their help in tracing Amisha.

After a lapse of 24 hours of search, the police find the body of Amisha entangled in a tree, approximately 75 feet below Sultana Drop. They find marks and cuts on her body and neck respectively; her ribs, left leg and cervical spine were broken. The police recover a cellphone and a note in her purse, which is found lying next to her body. The message on the note says, “I don't want to live anymore”. But, at the bottom of the note there are two small words scribbled away saying “NO HELP”

The police recorded the statements of the parents of Amisha, Nandini and other co-employees. A witness states before the police that he did see the quarrel between Amisha and Bhuvan, and also the interference by her co-employees. He also said that he saw Amisha, who was walking alone, being followed by the same person, with whom she had an altercation, at around 8:00am. However, the cause of death as per the post mortem report was due to ‘shock’, ‘hemorrhage and secondary head injuries’ sustained due to the fall

The time of death according to the report was well within 36 hours of her body being found. On the basis of report and the statements of witnesses, Bhuvan was arrested on suspicion for the murder of Amisha.

The Chargesheet has been submitted before the Chief Judicial Magistrate and the case is set for Trial before the Sessions Court Chickballapur.

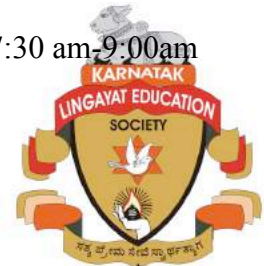

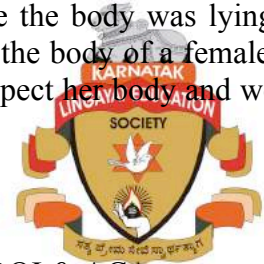

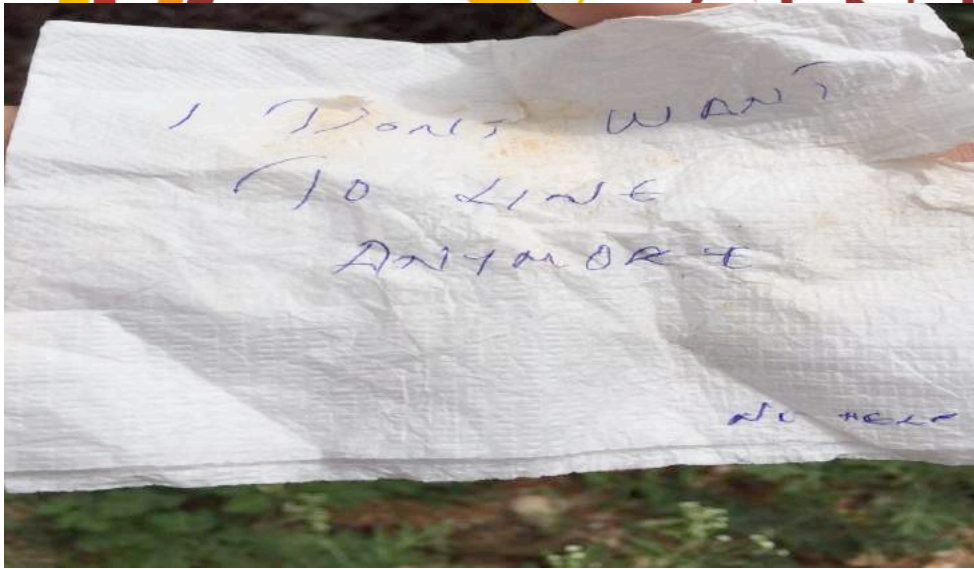

The neck is not of normal configuration and there are palpable masses. The extremities are symmetrical and normally developed. Identifying marks include a birthmark on the upper thigh and a mole on the left cheek. There is no evidence of emergency medical intervention in any form whatsoever. The left tibia is broken at two places and the left femur is fractured. Cervical spine is fractured. There are 3 broken ribs. There are signs of external aggression on the neck and arms. The face and hands are severely scratched and bruised.

Evidence of Injury

At the time of the post mortem the head was severely injured, the skull was cracked.

Internal Examination

The organs occupy normal positions, and all the internal organs are in a state of autolysis. There are no adhesions or mass lesions.

On 21/02/2016, the Police received a complaint stating that Amisha Gowda, the deceased went missing while she was on a trip with her co-employees at Chandi Hills. The report was filed by Mr. Lingaraju G., the father of the deceased. The Police reached the spot and a search was conducted. The search had to be ceased as it neared dusk. On the following day, 22/02/2016, the Police resumed the search in the morning and the body was recovered at around 1:00pm. The body of the deceased was identified by the father and Nandini, a co-employee. The deceased was clothed in white top, blue jeans and red sneakers, all of which was collected as part of evidence and her purse along with her smart phone was recovered. A handwritten note was also recovered from the spot. A Spot Mahazar was drawn and the body was sent for post mortem. An FIR was lodged by the father of the deceased on 22/02/2016, after procuring the post mortem report and the

investigation was taken up in pursuance of the same. The note which was recovered from the spot was sent for handwriting examination, but the result was inconclusive as the material was insufficient.

A hotel key was recovered from the spot where the altercation between the deceased and the accused took place. Upon tracing the source of the key, the Police was led to a hotel called The Hill Palace in Bengaluru, where the staff confirmed over telephone that the accused Bhuvan Dixit had occupied one of the rooms and was yet to check out as on 22/02/2016. On 23/02/2016 the police arrived at the said hotel. With the assistance of the Hotel manager they went up to the room where the accused Bhuvan was present, and arrested him. He was in a drunken condition at that point of time.

The witness statements of Mr. Lingaraju Gowda, the father of the deceased, Nandini Vijay, Suraj Bhatia and Vivek Rao, the co-employees of the deceased were taken.

It was clear from the statement of Nandini that the deceased was being harassed, humiliated, stalked and blackmailed by the accused over electronic media. These were corresponded from the publicly available Facebook page of the deceased that Bhuvan had clearly known the activities of Amisha.

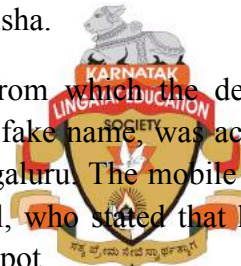
Amisha's phone was sent to Cyber Crime Division. The unknown numbers from which the deceased received threats from were traced to be registered in Karnataka, although under a fake name. was activated on the same day 03/02/2016, when the accused a resident of Delhi arrived in Bengaluru. The mobile device and the SIM card were not recovered. There was another witness Rajesh S. Patil, who stated that he saw Bhuvan at around 8:00 AM following Amisha the deceased as she was leaving the spot.

15. Therefore there is possible cause that the accused be tried for the offences punishable under sections 302, 354(d), 350, 506 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 and section 66E of IT Act, 2000.

REPORT OF INVESTIGATION OFFICER (CYBER POLICE)**Sidharth Iyer**

I am a SI with Bengaluru Police, Cyber Crime Division. A requisition to open and conduct a digital search of a phone, of the make Samsung Galaxy E7 Dual Sim of IMEI number 869087020881225 and 869087020881227, belonging to the deceased was made. On perusal of the same, a set of WhatsApp messages were retrieved from the specific phone number +919xx6482729 belonging to Bhuvan Dixit. Another set of WhatsApp messages were also retrieved, which were sent from a phone number that was not saved as a specific name in the contact list. This set of messages contained threats against Amisha. The specific number being +919xx5582729 is registered in Karnataka, with carrier Bodaphone. But the phone number was untraceable, the cellphone from which the number was used was also untraceable. The number was procured with fake documents. The call log recorded no entries of the incoming or outgoing calls. No activities from the said number were recorded since noon on 21/02/2016.



STATEMENT OF WITNESSES

NANDINI VIJAY(friend of victim)

My name is Nandini Vijay, I am 26 years old. I am a resident of Bengaluru and I work at ARS Technologies, Bengaluru. I know Amisha from past 2 years as we work at the same place. She was a very good friend of mine. We used to share everything with each other. One day Amisha told me about Bhuvan who contacted her through Humsafar.com. She told me that she chatted with him a few times and after that he proposed her to marry him. But she found him a little too possessive and aggressive while talking, so she stopped responding to his messages for 2 days. So I advised her to break off all communications with him on some pretext. She took my advice and messaged Bhuvan that her parents are against the proposal as she is a year older to him.

A few days later Amisha came to me and told that she is very depressed and feels like committing suicide because of the continuous messages and stalking by Bhuvan, So I advised her to inform her parents and seek help of the police before things went out of control. She even told me that suraj sir denied her promotion because she rejected his proposal. I told her that the employees of the company had planned a gateway to Chandi Hills, on the outskirts of Bengaluru, over the weekend, hoping that she would get things off her mind.

On 21/02/2016, we all left for Chandi Hills around 3:00 a.m. and reached there by 5:30 a.m. Later, we went to see the famous Sultana Drop and while walking up to see it, somebody in an inebriated condition came up to Amisha. I recognized him, the man was Bhuvan. He tried to talk to Amisha but she fought him off and asked him to stay away from her. But he did not listen to her and then Suraj Sir and Vivek interfered and finally Bhuvan walked away.

Then by around 7:30 am we all decided to go to a place close by to have tea and at that time Amisha said that she wanted to stay alone for some time as she was upset and will join us in a while. I advised her to come along but she insisted to stay, so I left along with other co-employees asking her to come soon.

It had almost been an hour that Amisha didn't come back, I got worried. So I went with my colleagues to look for her but couldn't find her. We decided to contact her parents and informed them that Amisha had gone missing. After an intense search by the police, they found her body the next day.

LINGARAJU GOWDA/ (father of the victim)

My name is Lingaraju Gowda. Amisha is my daughter. She is our only child. She was 26yrs old. She had a good job in a big company. She was a very smart child. We wanted her to get married to a good boy. A friend of ours told us about the matrimonial website Humsafar.com. We registered Amisha's name and created a profile for her on the website. A boy named Bhuvan contacted her through the same and started talking to her. She was very happy in the beginning but suddenly her behavior changed. She seemed very gloomy, was always in her room and wouldn't talk much to us. We thought that she was upset because she did not get her promotion.

On 21/2/2016 she told us that she was going for a trip to 'Chandi Hills'. She left the house in the morning around 2:30- 3:00 am. That same day in the morning her colleagues contacted us and told us that Amisha was missing. We immediately went to the nearest police station and filed a missing persons complaint hoping that the police will trace her fast. After an intense search by the police, they found her body the next day.

SURAJ (co-employee of the victim)

My name is Suraj Bhatia. I am 30 years old. I am a resident of Delhi. I work at ARS Technologies as head of operations. I have been working there for 5 years. I know Amisha from the past 2 years when she joined the company. She was a very hard working girl, always full of energy but for the past few days, she seemed little distracted/upset.

On 21/02/2016 I organised a trip to Chandi Hills. Noticing Amisha's behavior I told Nandini to get Amisha along with her for the trip. On that day we all left at around 3:00 a.m. and reached there at 5:30 a.m. We all went to see the famous Sultana Drop and while walking up to see it, somebody in an inebriated condition came up to Amisha. They were having an argument, she told him to stay away but he didn't listen. So Vivek (another employee) and I went to stop him. The man was reeking of alcohol. After intervening he left. Nandini consoled Amisha before we could leave to have some tea. But Amisha decided to stay alone for some time.

Around 8:30 am. Nandini told us that she is going to call Amisha as it had been an hour that she had not returned. So we went along with Nandini to search for Amisha. After searching the area she was not to be found. Then we decided to contact her parents to let them know what had happened. After we spoke to her parents, they went to the nearest police station to file a complaint. We continued searching for her but she was nowhere to be found. We left the place as it was getting dark. The next day, we were informed that Amisha's body was found.

VIVEK (co-employee of the victim)

My name is Vivek Rao. I am 27 years old. I am a resident of Bengaluru and I am working at ARS Technologies for the past 3 years and I know Amisha for the past 2 years from the time she joined the company. I never spoke much to her but she used to get along with everybody, especially with Nandini.

Suraj Sir had organised a trip to Chandi Hills on 21/02/2016. Our whole project team went for the trip and we all were very excited. Our entire group was enjoying the beauty of Chandi Hills. Until we reached Sultana Drop, where a man suddenly came up to Amisha and started fighting with her. She told him to go away but he didn't listen. Suraj Sir went up to the man to tell him to stop, so I followed him. The man was drunk as he was smelling of alcohol and was talking in an aggressive tone. After intervening he walked away. After the situation calmed down, we went to have tea to a place nearby. Then after sometime Suraj Sir told me to come along with him to search for Amisha as she didn't come back.

We didn't find Amisha anywhere around the restaurant. So, the whole team went looking for her. After searching for her everywhere, she was not to be found. So Nandini and Suraj Sir decided to contact her parents. We were looking for her everywhere, and then we left the place. The next day, we were informed that Amisha's body was found by the police.

RAJESH S PATIL(witness)

My name is Rajesh S Patil. I am 35 years old. I am a waiter in a restaurant in Chandi Hills. On 21/02/2016, around 7:00 – 7:30 am I went to the Sultana Drop for a break. There I saw Amisha and Bhuvan quarrelling. When her co-employees interfered Bhuvan left. After few minutes everybody left the place but Amisha stayed back.

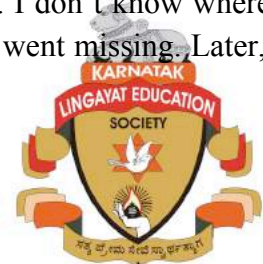
Then somewhere around 8:00 am. I saw Amisha walking alone, being followed by Bhuvan, the same person with whom she had an altercation. I left the place as I had to go for my next shift. I don't know where they went or what happened after that. In the evening my colleagues told me that a girl went missing. Later, I got to know that it was Amisha, the same girl I saw in the morning.

SHIVARAM GUPTA (PANCH WITNESS)

My name is Shivaram Gupta. I am 34 years old and residing at #63, 15th cross, East West Colony, Chandi Hills, Chickballapur district – 05. I am a tea vendor and I sell on Chandi Hills. Sub- Inspector Hardik P. called me to be a panch witness. I agreed to be the witness out of my own free consent. I saw the police team inspect the body on 22nd February 2016. The officers introduced themselves to me. They also showed their identity card and disclosed their purpose of visit by showing the warrant of authorization for the investigation. They also requested me to be present when the complainant Lingaraju Gowda identified the body of the deceased. I saw the body hang around 75 feet below Sultana Drop. The body was entangled in a tree. It was the body of a female. I saw her clothes and the identification mark on her left cheek. Then the police inspected her body and they recovered her purse and its contents i.e. a phone and a piece of paper.

The officers introduced themselves to me. They also showed their identity card and disclosed their purpose of visit by showing the warrant of authorization for the investigation. I saw the complainant identify the body of the deceased. I saw the body hang around 75 feet below Sultana Drop. The body was entangled in a tree. It was a female. She was white top, blue jeans and brown sneakers and there was a mole on her left cheek. Then the police inspected her body and they recovered her purse and its contents from the crime scene.
