The Heritage Club of KLE Society's Law College, Bengaluru, on the occasion of World Heritage Day, is organizing a three-day workshop on 'Archaeology and Antiquarian Law' at our college premises from 18th April 2022 to 20th April 2022, in collaboration with Archaeological Survey of India, Bangalore circle.

India is one of the richest countries in terms of Archaeological heritage – both movable and immovable. The uniqueness of the rich cultural wealth of India has made it very vulnerable to illicit trafficking. Therefore, the Government of India as well the State governments have framed various legislations for protecting our heritage property. The aim of the Workshop/Training is to introduce to Law Students and Legal professionals to Archaeology and Antiquarian laws that are enacted to protect our cultural heritage and its various implications in the present society.

## **KLE Society's Law College, Bengaluru**

## **Heritage Club**

As part of commemorating the centenary year of KLE Society, we have decided to set up a Heritage club in the Department of History to organize various programs including a series of Workshops, Seminars, Heritage walks, Explorations, Research in the disciplines of Indian and Legal History and Culture, Archaeology and Antiquarian Law. We are also making an attempt to understand all aspects of our Indian Heritage or any other Heritage in the world.

The club also aims to develop respect for diversity in cultures. Cultural awareness programs are conducted to encourage the younger generation to protect and preserve our monuments and cultural heritage. The Heritage Club is also providing research grants to Legal Students and Scholars to conduct cutting-edge research in various fields of Legal History that are theoretical, and practical, and affect the policy and its implementation.

## **Archaeological Survey of India, Bangalore Circle, Bengaluru.**

In the year 1975, the Mid-Southern circle was created as an independent circle with the intention of bringing all the centrally protected monuments of Karnataka under one circle. Earlier, these monuments were under the jurisdiction of the Southern Circle, Madras Presidency, and Southwestern circle of Bombay Presidency. As many as 535 monuments from all over Karnataka came under its jurisdiction. In the year 1996, this Mid-southern Circle, for more efficient monitoring was further bifurcated into Bangalore and Dharwad Circles. Bangalore Circle was given the jurisdiction of South Karnataka (218 monuments) while Dharwad Circle was given the jurisdiction of North Karnataka (317 monuments). In September 2014, a mini circle known as Hampi was formed by bifurcating Bangalore Circle, and about 85 monuments of Bangalore Circle, located in Bellary district, came under its jurisdiction. In 2021, during further delineation of the Circles, 04 Monuments of Bangalore Circle were brought under the jurisdiction of Hampi Circle. At present ASI, Bangalore Circle has under its jurisdiction 129 Monuments/ Sites located in as many as 17 districts like Bangalore Urban, Bangalore Rural, Chamarajanagar, Chikkaballapur, Chikmagalur, Chitradurga, Davanagere, Hassan, Kolar, Coorg, Mandya, Mysore, Ramanagara, Shimoga, South Kanara, Tumkur, and Udupi.



## Workshop overview:

This workshop explores the history of Legislations passed during the pre and post Independence period to protect the cultural wealth of the country. It also covers the important legislations in force and its importance in Cultural Heritage Management. The challenges faced in the implementation of these legislations from the perspective of different stakeholders will also be studied in this workshop.
